## HOW HOT IS TOO HOT FOR DOGS?



The unofficial start to summer is here with wonderful warm temperatures! But did you know that for **some** dogs, even "mild" temperatures (in the 70s F) can cause them to overheat with potentially dangerous consequences **Learn how to protect your dog from dangerous heat!**

### Canines & Overheating

**Remember**, all dogs are susceptible to overheating; **no** dog is immune. However, some dogs are at an **even greater risk** including those:

- ~ With flat, pushed-in faces and short noses.
- ~ With long hair.
- ~ Who are very young or very old.
- ~ With heart or kidney disease, or
- ~ Who are overweight or obese.

Please leave Fido at home, **NEVER** in the car!

### Signs Your Dog is TOO Hot

If you bring your dog along this summer, keep a close eye on them at all times to intervene **before** they get dangerously overheated. **If you see any of the five signs below, get your dog out of the heat immediately!**

- ~ Excessive, non-stop panting.
- ~ Thick, sticky-looking saliva and excessive salivation/drooling.
- ~ Brightly colored gums (red or blue).
- ~ Disorientation, or
- ~ Sudden vomiting or diarrhea.

### WARNING

Do NOT immerse an overheated dog in cold water or an ice bath! Such a drastic temperature change is dangerous because it constricts the skin's blood vessels reducing all heat loss.

### PROPERLY Cooling Down an Overheated Dog

- ~ Keep a close eye on your dog especially if they are exercising or playing with other dogs because many canines will push themselves beyond what is safe.
- ~ Keep him well-hydrated with clean, fresh water at least once/hour.
- ~ Periodically remove your dog from the direct sunlight or take him inside the house to make sure he cools down.

## SUMMER BBQs AND YOUR DOG!



It's finally the unofficial start of summer and that means BBQs! But it also means keeping a **close eye** on your dog whenever you grill!

You know how hungry you get when you smell the grill, just imagine what it does to your dog's brain! Follow the **4 tips below** to keep your curious and sneaky dog **safe** when grilling.

1. Keep your dog at a **safe distance** from a hot grill to prevent unwanted burns or a potential fire hazard if a curious or hungry pup knocks over the grill!
2. Also keep your dog at a **safe distance** from the picnic table and potentially unsafe foods, condiments, snacks and alcohol.
3. Keep barbecue seasonings, rubs and marinades **out of reach**.
4. **Never** give your dog cooked bones from the grill! Cooked bones splinter into sharp pieces that can wreak havoc on your dog's mouth, throat and intestines. **Ask guests to follow this rule too!**

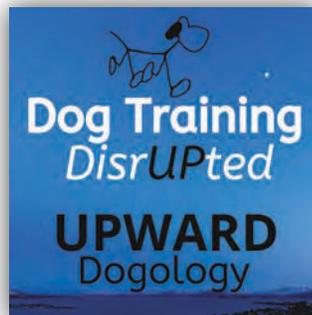

## SWEET POTATO K9 FRIES!

Healthy sweet potatoes, dog-friendly and beneficial **turmeric** and **cinnamon** coated with coconut oil plus just 10 minutes to prep equals an **easy yet healthy** dog treat!

- ~ Sweet potato (washed and peeled)
- ~ 1 tablespoon coconut oil (melted)
- ~ Turmeric and cinnamon

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F.

Cut the sweet potato into evenly sized, long skinny (fry-shaped) pieces. Coat well with melted oil and spices in a large bowl or Ziploc bag.

Place fries on baking sheet in one layer. Bake for 15 minutes.

Flip over fries for even baking and bake for another 10-15 minutes.

Completely cool before giving to your dog!
